Education:

Accomplishments

1. Seven of our sponsored children studying in Starehe Boys Center and School completed their secondary level and joined university study courses of their choice ranging from medicine, engineering, law, Education, Business among others.
2. We had 33 sponsored children complete their studies in various universities. One of the students, Festus Maseki (STB12841) who graduated is now working with KPMG, a multinational firm that deals with audit and advisory work.

3. We now have **317** sponsored children in universities and this is a very big milestone towards transformation of lives considering the fact that they have grown from very humble backgrounds. Great thanks to Chalice for the continued support.

Goals

1. To ensure that all the sponsored students complete university and are ushered into their areas of specialization and profession.
2. To see to it that every sponsored student is comfortable through their studies by providing the basic needs needed through the process of studying.
3. To ensure that there are zero dropouts from school by any of our sponsored students. No dropout case has been experienced but we take full precaution on this matter.
4. To establish a mentorship programme to primary schools. The programme is to be run by the university/college students sponsored by Chalice.

Direct Family Funding (DFF) and Special Money

Achievements:

1. All our sponsored students access bank services, they have bank accounts and continued to receive funds directly. This has helped them take care of their day to day needs while in school. We are grateful to you sponsors for all the support. Students can now study comfortably and fully concentrate on their studies.

2. The extra funds received by our beneficiaries in form of special money support in their studies by providing items such as laptops, reading and research materials.

Goals:

1. To ensure that students who benefit from DFF use the funds to enhance their learning and research in their field of studies.

Family and Community

Accomplishments

1. The site donated 20 desks to Muslim Primary school in one of the slum areas within Nairobi which brought comfort and smiles on the faces of the children and the teachers.
2. The Site also donated massage oil, roll bolls, massager, toys, electric kettle and food blender to the Special Unit in Muslim Primary school. The special unit houses children with cerebral palsy and those with various disabilities.



3. The site also donated foodstuff in form of maize flour, wheat flour, and porridge flour, rice, cooking oil and milk to Kariobangi and Cindi's Hope children's homes in the slums of Nairobi as we shared the birth of Christ over the Christmas period.



Goals

- To establish a constant relationship with the community with more focus on nutrition and hygiene programmes.
- To establish libraries to the disadvantaged schools in order to sharpen the communication and study skills of children in these schools.
- To increase the quantity of school material towards the primary schools supported by the site.
- To get more equipment for the cerebral palsy unit. These equipment include wheelchairs and other mobility devices.
