



## Annual Report 2018 : Cotabato Site

### A. Education :

1. This year (March 2018) we have graduated 3 students in college—all have taken up Education as their course. 70 students finished grade 10, 23 students in grade 12 and 138 in Elementary school.
2. Even if our School Principal at the site resigned in August, we had a smooth turn-over to our new one: Ms. Jinelyn B. Francisco who is a teacher with us since 2006. She already has been trained to do the job and will be taking up post-graduate courses beginning this coming summer courtesy of the Oblates. Morale among teachers, fieldworkers and staff remain high despite the unplanned chalice withdrawal of funding support 3 yrs. from now.



#### *Goals:*

1. Advocate and inspire parents of school children/students to continue to support school programs despite aforementioned sad news.
2. Plan for self-sustainability regarding continuing education of children despite DFF withdrawal in 2021.

### B. Health & Hygiene:

#### *Accomplishments:*

1. Continuing evaluation and promotion of “health card “ of children.
2. Prompt response and hospitalization of children with serious illnesses. Accessing governmental & non-governmental financial support for medical bills.

### C. Nutrition:

#### *Accomplishments:*

1. Lunch-time feeding at school site continued.
2. Children taught to cook wholesome and nutritious meals grown locally during Nutrition Month celebration/showcase.



*Goals:*

1. Teach –in and continue periodic advocacy by doing cook-ins at school towards healthy cooking habits.
2. Intensify backyard gardening specifying the planting of root crops and leafy vegetables.

**C. Community / Family:**

*Accomplishments:*

1. Aside from the 1<sup>st</sup> Friday communal work practice, the site has organized a chapel-based farm and fishpond area resulting from the recent “mass baptism/confirmation” of Pangipasan.
2. Expansion area farm in Imelda created into a common banana and garden-crops workplace. Proceeds go to CCG common fund.
  - ( CCG’s enabled and using capital outlay for small –case business farm enterprise)



*Goals:*

1. Chalice college graduates tasked to help out in their respective areas to process legal/paperworks/certificates vis-a-vis local Government units.
2. To continue to advocate for Education despite Chalice Funding withdrawal.

**E. DFF:**

*Accomplishments:*

1. Every CCG have created common compact farms for additional income.

*Goals:*

1. To prepare for DFF withdrawal in 2021.
2. To advocate importance of unity and cohesiveness in common efforts to promote continuing Education of children.
