

Annual Report 2019-2020 Haiti North site Terrier-Rouge and Grand Bassin, Haiti



Chalice sponsorship began in the communities of Terrier-Rouge and Grand-Bassin in 1999. Haiti has been struggling with significant political upheaval and contracting economy. Food security is a primary and growing concern. Through the Chalice nutrition program, children in schools benefit from school meals. The site conducts health assessments for the children and monitors their development and provides workshops for parent groups on the importance of nutrition. The site runs a successful community poultry cooperative program.





- Haiti North site supports 1812 sponsored children.
- 88.21% of sponsored children in the NDS sub-site and 89.7% in NDG sub-site successfully completed their school year.
- 63 sponsored youth are attending university or vocational training courses.
- 7 students graduated from their trade courses:
 1 in plumbing, 2 in tiling, 1 in electrical and 2 in computer fundamentals.
- 1187 children across 6 schools benefited from the breakfast program through Chalice's nutrition program. They received a nutritious meal of food such as eggs and milk 3 times per week.

Family

- Haiti North works with 1499 families organized into 53 family circles.
- Each family circle is led by a committee of 5 members who act as leaders and assist their fellow parents in creating budgets. The circles also conduct internal loans among members, enabling members to buy items to help them begin income-generating activities.
- Through the support of the Chalice gift catalogue, the site gave 1499 families a hamper of grocery items, including rice, sardines and oil.



Community

- 506 students at Notre Dame de Lourdes school and patients of the Grand Bassin medical clinic received a safe and sanitary bathroom facility to stop the spread of preventable illness.
- 300 students of Presbyteral Coeur Immaculé school and their teachers are benefiting from a new roof. Their teachers also each received a new metal desk.
