MISSION OUTCOMES

What we want to do:

- Our Canadian and Ukrainian volunteers, staff and families will:
 - (a) share stories and dialogue to **learn from one another**, and
 - (b) collaborate in **service projects**.
- Our Canadian team will invite others to support our mission by **sponsoring a child** from Ukraine, and we will collectively **raise funds** to support the communities served by Pochaiv Sponsor Site.

The changes we want to see:

- Through meaningful dialogue, interaction, prayer and service, we will be invited to **see and care for one another as brothers and sisters**.
- We will have a **greater understanding** of both the challenges we face, as well as our capacity (with God's grace!) to respond with love and support.
- We will gain insight into Chalice's mission, how it is carried out at Pochaiv Site, as well as how it may be carried out differently around the world; as a result, we will be **empowered to collaborate in this mission**, "to bring Christ to the poor and the poor to Christ."

LEARNING & SERVING ON MISSION

**If you travel with a firm list of things you will experience and accomplish, you will likely be disappointed.
If you travel primarily as a learner, you are bound to succeed!**

Learning and service activities are planned with the sponsor site staff to **complement their work** in the communities we will visit. Activities are further tailored to the **skills and experience of our volunteer team**.



Our site director, Halyna Mykytiuk, is inviting Chalice volunteers and staff to come learn and serve within the following contexts in the community:

○ **Home Vegetable Growing and Greenhouses**

Let's support our families in growing all-season vegetables (green onion, radish, parsley, dill, basil, etc.) to sell in local markets. Families keep their own gardens, but would like to increase knowledge.

Learning areas include:

- Selecting and sprouting seeds
- Ecological considerations
- Nourishing
- Marketing
- Harvesting
- Installing a greenhouse



○ **Summer School for Student Government Leaders**

Let's support our students' hopeful futures with leadership formation among grades 8-10 students.

Learning areas include:

- Avoiding addictions, including electronics
- Healthy lifestyle
- First aid introduction
- Motivating oneself for development
- How to study, and directing this effort towards future income
- Financial planning
- Resume and job interview preparation



○ **Training Workshop for Site Staff & School Organizers**

Let's support our community leaders to enhance their skills as social workers, administrators and directors.

Learning areas include:

- Administrating
- Managing and supervising staff
- Reporting, seeing results
- Motivation, performance
- Workflow organization, prioritization
- Managing workload, avoiding burnout
- Skills in home violence resistance



○ **Lunch Meal Preparation**

Let's support the mission training sessions while learning about Ukrainian cooking. 108 sponsored children (from sub-site IVF) attend the school where we will be stationed each training day. Join the mothers of sponsored children to prepare lunch for everyone involved with our training sessions under the guidance of the school cafeteria chef and sous-chef. For volunteers who are interested, there will also be opportunities for knowledge sharing in nutrition.

CHALICE'S MISSION

"To bring Christ to the poor and the poor to Christ."

Chalice is a Canadian Catholic charity that primarily supports community initiatives in developing countries through the sponsorship of children and elders in need. Chalice is based in Bedford, Nova Scotia and brings hope to over **50,000 children and elders at 58 sponsor sites in 15 countries**, with no regard for gender, race or religious affiliation. Every sponsor site is under local direction, as we work closely with lay people, religious congregations and local communities in their efforts to provide care for families caught in the dehumanizing grip of extreme poverty and lack of education. Chalice has been named one of the top 100 Canadian charities in MacLean's 2020 Best Charities list, tying for second place overall, and ranked first place in international charities. CHALICE'S WORK IN UKRAINE

Chalice has been serving children, families and communities in Ukraine since 1998 in three sites in both rural and urban communities. Our local partners tell us that Chalice is one of few international charities in their region, because the central government makes charitable work difficult with complex taxation laws.



Ballooning inflation has dramatically increased the costs of necessities such as food and heating. Coupled with high rates of unemployment or under-salaried work, parents have difficulty providing for their families. In the areas where Chalice works, there are high rates of chronic illness and cognitive disabilities such as cerebral palsy and Down syndrome. Low-income families have little access to quality medical services because public hospitals are underfunded and ill-equipped.

Through the support of sponsors and donors, Chalice and our local partners focus on:

- ❖ **Education** – Ensuring each child completes their education until high school graduation, at a minimum.
- ❖ **Financial inclusion & empowerment for parents** – Giving caregivers back their decision-making power for the needs of their families.
- ❖ **Nutrition & household needs** – Providing families with fresh produce and staples to ensure their children maintain nutrient-rich, balanced diets. Assistance is also provided to help with the high cost of basic household needs such as heating and simple housewares.

OUR POCHAIV SPONSOR SITE PARTNERS

During our mission, we will spend time at one of Chalice's three Ukrainian sponsor sites: **Pochaiv Sponsor Site**. At Pochaiv Site, Chalice has partnered with **World for Children** since 1999. **Halyna Mykytiuk** directs the sponsorship program, based in three subsites in the Ivano-Frankivsk and Volyn Regions. The Site's Central Office is located in the village of Malechkovychi in the Pustomyty District, a suburb of the city of Lviv. The program currently supports **1960 children** living with their families in either dorm-style factory apartments in cities and towns or rural family homes with small farms. The site works closely with beneficiaries to develop agricultural skills to sustain small family farms. Through Chalice programs, including the gift catalogue, Pochaiv Site supports orphanages and many schools throughout the area.

TIME TO SHARE & GROW IN OUR FAITH

Our team will begin each day together by sharing and reflecting on a passage from the Bible or another text of spiritual significance to one of our team members. At the close of each day, we will also be invited to share about and reflect on our experiences from that day. We will participate in the Catholic Mass on Sundays and participate in other forms of local community prayer.

ESTIMATED COST

Mission expenses are currently estimated at **\$3,725 CAD**, broken down as follows:

\$500	Mission trip program fee
\$1500	Mission expense donation (land transportation, accommodations, meals, water, service activities, etc.)
\$100	Touring fee (To be confirmed; separated from expense donation as it is not eligible for an official donation receipt for tax purposes)
\$1625	Flight + CAP Insurance (varies; from home cities we meet on route, most likely in Toronto)

The mission expense donation is eligible for an official donation receipt. Airfare is also eligible, conditional on personal travel plans; discuss with the mission coordinator for clarification.

In addition, the following costs are paid by volunteers directly:

- Travel Insurance* (medical, cancellation & interruption)
- Hotel* & meals in transit (if route requires)
- Immunizations and medications
- Incidentals, tips, alcoholic beverages.

*We will provide booking options through our travel agent.
